When choosing subjects to study, it can be important to consider your plans for the future. If you already have a definite career or university course in mind, ensure that you are choosing the right Post 16 courses.

Please note that courses will only run subject to sufficient numbers taking the courses. In the unlikely circumstance that one of your preferred options does not run, we will support you with advice and guidance to choose the best alternative.

All students are required to achieve a minimum of a grade 5 in English Language and Mathematics, along with subject specific requirements.

Tutoring

At Q3 Academy we operate a year based tutor system, with Year 12 and 13 students being placed into dedicated Sixth Form tutor groups. Students will remain with the same tutor for the two years they are with us, resulting in students receiving information and undertaking tasks specifically tailored to Sixth Form.

Each student is offered specific advice and help with careers and further education. As part of their care for their tutees, tutors follow students' progress throughout their applications to university and also contribute towards their UCAS references.

Parents of Year 12 students have the opportunity to meet with their child's tutor after the initial settling in period to discuss progress and achievements.

Tutors are normally your first port of call should you have any worries about your child's progress.


Biannually, students visit Thailand in support of the links O3 Academy Sixth Form has with the Rainbow House Orphanage.




