RE: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and Overseas Educational Visits

In response to the outbreak of the Coronavirus, the Academy is following the advice of Public Health England, the Department of Health, and the Department for Education to promote the safety and wellbeing of our students, staff, and local community.

Any students, staff, or visitors to the Academy who have recently returned from any category 1 specified country or area have been asked to not attend the Academy, and to self-isolate for 14 days, calling NHS 111 if they become unwell.

There are no recent educational visits or trips returning from, or due to travel to, a category 1 or category 2 specified country or area. Regarding upcoming educational visits or trips, currently there are minimal cases outside the risk areas, and as such, the likelihood of an individual coming into contact with a confirmed case is low. There is no current advice to avoid travel to any of the countries planned for our students to visit. However, we will continue to monitor the situation and follow the advice of the relevant authorities. If the travel advice changes then we will contact parents/carers of the individual students affected as soon as we are able.


Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas
